A novel approach to monitoring illicit drug use in the community is showcased by the EU drugs agency (EMCDDA) in the latest edition (9) of its Insights series. Entitled Assessing illicit drugs in wastewater: Potential and limitations of a new monitoring approach, the report looks at how analysing communal wastewater (e.g. from treatment plants) for residues of illicit drugs can provide real-time insights into local drug consumption levels and changing trends. World Update

Afghanistan

In the past eight months, over 300 tonnes of cannabis, over 25 tonnes of opium and over 10 tonnes of heroin, as well as several tonnes of heroin-producing chemicals, were impounded. Twenty-five heroin-producing laboratories were also destroyed, according to the Interior Ministry. A senior official in the Interior Ministry says that "unprecedented progress" has been made in the fight against drugs, with at least 500 drug traffickers arrested. http://www.irinnews.org/Report.aspx?ReportId=81896

OxyContin

OxyContin® is a prescription painkiller used for moderate to high pain relief associated with injuries, bursitis, dislocations, fractures, neuralgia, arthritis, lower back pain, and pain associated with cancer. OxyContin® contains oxycodone, the medication's active ingredient, in a timed-release tablet. Subutex

Subutex (buprenorphine hydrochloride) and Suboxone tablets (buprenorphine hydrochloride and naloxone hydrochloride) is approved for the treatment of opiate dependence. Subutex and Suboxone treat opiate addiction by preventing symptoms of withdrawal from heroin and other opiates.

Withdrawal Symptoms in the Golden Triangle: A Drugs Market in Disarray

Drug control agencies have called the significant decline in opium production in Southeast Asia over the past decade a 'success story'. The latest report of the Transnational Institute (TNI). based on in-depth research in the region, casts serious doubts on this claim noting that Southeast Asia suffers from a variety of 'withdrawal symptoms' that leave little reason for optimism.
